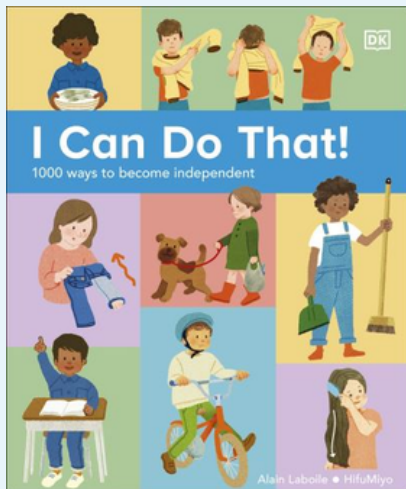

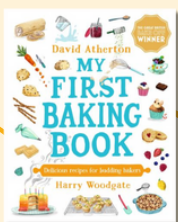

- 5 Who do you trust to help you with more challenging tasks?
- 6 Can this person be different at different times?
- 6 Is there anything you always ask the same person for help with? What might be the benefits/ problems with this?
- 7 Can you describe a time when you have had to show real resilience to learn a new skill? How did you keep going? How did it feel when you succeeded?
